

## **Dil Araştırmaları**

### **International Refereed Journal**

#### **Editorial Principles**

*Dil Araştırmaları* is an international refereed journal and it is published twice a year as spring and fall seasons. An index is prepared and published at the end of each fourth issue. Each issue is forwarded to national/ international libraries and international indexing institutions determined by editorial board and to subscribers.

**Aim:** *Dil Araştırmaları* is published to bring forth original studies in the fields of Turkish Language, linguistics, historical and modern Turkish Dialects and to inform the public opinion about these studies.

**Topic:** Articles related to historical and modern Turkish Dialects and linguistics are published in *Dil Araştırmaları*

**Content:** Articles forwarded for publication must be original, contributing to knowledge and scientific information in related fields or bringing forth new views and perspectives. Articles shouldn't have been previously published or accepted to be published elsewhere. Papers presented at conferences may be accepted (provided that it is clearly stated). Articles introducing works and critiques can also be published in *Dil Araştırmaları*.

**Evaluation of Articles:** Articles forwarded to *Dil Araştırmaları* are first reviewed by the editorial board in terms of journal's publishing principles. Those regarded as acceptable are initially sent to two referees who are well-known for their studies in the fields. Articles are published if the referees sent affirmative reports. If one of the reports is affirmative and the other is negative, it is forwarded to a third referee. Names of the authors are not sent to the referees. Names of the referees are also kept secret. The reports are kept for five years.

The authors are expected to consider the criticism, suggestions and corrections proposed by the referees. If the authors disagree, they are entitled to express their views with justifications. Articles which are not accepted for publication can be returned to their authors if requested.

**The Language of Publication:** The publication language of *Dil Araştırmaları* is Turkish. Articles in other Turkish dialects may be published upon the decision of the Editorial Board in each issue.

#### **Writing Rules**

**1. Title:** The title should be written in bold, with 14 type size.

**2. Name of the Author:** It should be written with the surname in small letters and bold, under the title and on the right side. Academic position, institution and e-mail address should be written in italics with an asterisk as a footnote to the surname at the bottom of the first page.

**3. Abstract:** The article should include an abstract in Turkish and English (in maximum 100 words) at the beginning of the text. There should be no reference to sources used, figures and charts etc. There should be key words, maximum ten words, under the abstract. Abstracts and key words should be written in Turkish and English.

**4. Main Text:** The article should be written in MS word program in Times New Roman, 11 type size and 1 line on A4 format papers. There should be 3 cm space on the margins and pages should be numbered. Articles should not exceed 10000 words. The examples should be in italic, their equivalents in Turkish should be in quotation marks and not in italic. The articles must confirm to the writing rules of The Turkish Language Association. If the author had used a special font type, he should forward it with the article. Besides, the pictures and figures etc. in the article should be numbered.

**5. Indicating Sources and Citations:** References within the text should be given with name and date and/or page in parentheses as follows: (Hacıeminoğlu 1991), (Hacıeminoğlu 1991: 30). Citations less than 3 lines should be typed between lines and in quotation marks; citations more than 3 lines should be typed with indent of 1 cm in block, 9 type size and with 1 line space. At which university, for which academic position and when the cited dissertations are prepared should be stated.

Footnotes should be numbered at the bottom of the page, and be used only for explanations.

**6. References:** References should be typed at the end of the text in alphabetical order of the authors' surnames, with 9 type size and 1 line space as follows. The names of the works should be in italic, the names of the articles should be in quotation marks and other information should be as in the examples. If there are more than one source by the same author, then they will be listed according to their publication date; sources of the same author published in the same year will be shown as 2008a, 2008b.

### **How to Forward Articles**

The articles prepared in accordance with the principles should be sent to the e-mail address given below. The articles returned to the authors for correction and improvement should be sent back to the Journal not later than one month. Minor editing may be done by Editorial Board.

Articles not prepared in accordance with the principles above will not be published. The scientific responsibility of the published articles and legal responsibility of the translations belong to the authors/translators.

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
